- 16. What are the advantages for a home-rule city over that of a general law city? (p. 386). What is the minimum population for a city to adopt a home-rule charter?
- 17. What are the three basic forms of city government? Understand the basic organization of each. What is the most common system of city government organization in Texas? (p. 388-392)
- 18. What are the four basic electoral systems that cities may use? Understand the basic principles of each. (pp. 329-394) What are the advantages and disadvantages of each?
- 19. What is zoning? Review the pros and cons of zoning? (p. 395-396) Read the section on the use of local ordinance power to go beyond state law.
- 20. What are the contrasts between cities and counties discussed on p. 399?
- 21. Read the section on HOA (Home Owner's Associations) No specific questions.
- 22. What are independent school districts? How are they governed? (p. 402)
